Statistics

- FAM's educational program serves children and youth of **both sexes from 10 different communities** in the region.
- Total enrollment during 2019, from Preschool to High School was 115.
- In Elementary School, **52% of children are girls** and **48% are boys**;
- In Secondary School and High School, 45% are girls and 55% are boys.
- During the 2019 academic term, 23,125 nutritional meals were served to a total of 125 people, including students and teachers.
- Additionally, during 185 school days, 105 people, including teachers and students, enjoyed free daily transportation to and from their communities to attend class.
- Nine surrounding communities were served by FAM Program.

FAM's Educational Program improves coverage and quality of education in La Reforma,
San Marcos by:

- 1. Improving the quality of education through continuing and specialized education of its teachers;
- 2. Expanding and improving program benefits for children and youth, allowing equal opportunities and access to quality education for all;
- 3. Fostering a culture of responsibility and seeking the best outcomes for teachers, students and families in the region.
- 4. Using updated and innovating methodologies and tools in the learning process.





Activities and Accomplishments 2019

Activities

- Valentine's Day celebration: youth and teachers exchanged gifts and cards, and held a small celebration that included snacks.
- School council election: Teachers helped organize the school council election. Students participated in polling stations and voted, following a nomination and campaign process.
- Youth Day: An afternoon of sports and recreation activities was organized and held at the multi-sports court and swimming pool at Cantón San Pedrito in La Reforma, San Marcos.
- Inauguration of friendly spaces: Ministry of Health staff and one of their ambulances joined the Youth Day caravan. Later, ministry educators talked to students about self-esteem and the school community in different groups.
- Participation in the Independence Day parade: Schools participated in an event held in La Reforma San Marcos on September 15 that included a rhythmic gymnastics demonstration.
- World's Day for Children: With the support of donors, a special celebration was held for preschool and elementary school students on October 1st.


