This month reminded us how deeply our staff cares for our students.

Earlier in February, one of our students arrived at school with serious burns in his eyes after an accident at home. His family did not have the resources to seek medical care, but thanks to the quick response of our staff, he was taken to the nearest city to see an ophthalmologist and receive the treatment he needed—very likely saving his vision.

And as happens in any school, accidents can occur. When another student recently suffered a broken arm, our Nursing and Medicine teacher—who is a licensed nurse and former firefighter trained in first aid—immediately provided care before the student was taken to the hospital.
